STEP costs \$60 per person to cover the cost of program materials and space — payable in cash, cashier's check, or money order ... addressed to "CJAM"


CJAM does offer payment plans and will consider financial hardships.

STEP offers Offenders the opportunity to:

- Understand the real human consequences of the offense including the effects for the victim;
- Make amends and meaningfully right the wrong by participating in a community education and crime prevention program;
- Express emotions about the offense including remorse and apology if appropriate;
- To restore self-image as a competent person instead of a criminal;
- Restore the relationship with the victim, if and when appropriate.

To complete the STEP program, your participation will include:

- One 30 minute Intake appointment with a trained volunteer mediator to listen to your story and circumstances, and to explain the STEP program in more detail. Each participant receives a STEP workbook that includes take-home activities;
- One 2-hour Community Conference that involves a small group meeting of other STEP participants;
- One 30 minute Follow-up appointment to offer STEP coordinators feedback about the program and to verify workbook completeness.
